FYI: Catholic means “universal”. In the Nicene Creed, we speak of the church as being “**one, holy, catholic and apostolic.**” In so doing, we are not referring to any particular church or denomination (such as Roman Catholicism), but rather to all true believers in Jesus, in all places, throughout all of time.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

- ⊕ We invite all baptized Christians, regardless of denomination, to the Lord’s table for Holy Communion.
- ⊕ Please proceed forward as directed by the ushers, and then to the communion station on your side of the room.
- ⊕ The bread and wine are served in small covered plastic cups. We offer real and non-alcoholic wine, which is clearly marked, as well as gluten-free wafers.
- ⊕ After consuming the wafer and wine, please dispose of the cups in the white plastic receptacles.
- ⊕ After partaking, you may kneel at the rail as desired; please return to your seat by way of the outer aisles.
- ⊕ We proclaim that Jesus Christ is present in the consecrated bread and wine in a real, yet mysterious way.

I was brought up attending the First Christian Church, Disciples of Christ where I was taught about what I remember was mostly Old Testament Bible stories in Sunday School. My brothers and I also sat through the church service with our mother and heard sermons about love, service, giving, and Christ crucified. At age 9 we moved, and I didn’t attend church again until Vacation Bible School at Talbot Park Baptist Church when I was 11 or 12 years old.

At the end of the Bible School, there was an opportunity presented for Baptism and church membership. I followed the crowd and signed up. Now, whether it was a Spiritual experience or more an exciting adventure to be immersed and told I was saved in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost. (They said Holy Ghost a lot in the 1950’s instead of “Holy Spirit.”) I attended the Baptist church off-and-on until I joined the U.S. Army at age 18. My faith was intact, but my Spirituality was sorely lacking until one night in (I think) 1974 or 1975 when my wife and I attended an evening at the local military Chapel. Country and Pop singer Wanda Jackson was there. She sang and gave her testimony, and for the first time, I felt what it meant to be truly “moved in the Spirit.” When Wanda sang “Jesus put a Yodel in My Soul,” tears came to my eyes.

My wife and I both responded to the altar call, and we rededicated our lives to following Jesus and sincere worship. Since then, I have fallen and been picked up (spiritually) countless times. I have never doubted the love of Christ and my faith is positive and unyielding. Scripture tells us: “Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it.” I believe Proverbs 22:6. I was trained up and have continued to be taught in the way I should go. While I have fought it, God has let me get old. I have finally surrendered. With God’s help, I will not depart from the path again.

It’s awful how many churches have forsaken scripture and the principles laid down as a rule and guide for our faith and practice. Jo’el (my wife) and I are worshiping at All Saints because those principles are not compromised. When I say the sermons are full of Love, Discipleship, and Christ Crucified, I can rest assured that scripture is respected. Is anyone excluded from worship at All Saints? NO! Is everyone welcome? YES! Do I feel good about coming to church here and the pastor? I should say I do. I’ve found my forever church home and I’ve found my Spiritual center in life and practice. Praise God and May God continue to bless All Saints Anglican Church.

Collect (Summary Prayer) of the Day

Almighty God, whose only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven: May our hearts and minds also there ascend, and with him continually dwell; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Acts 1:1-11 - English Standard Version

In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, ² until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³ He presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴ And while staying with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, “you heard from me; ⁵ for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.” ⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, “Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?” ⁷ He said to them, “It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.” ⁹ And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.”

A MIRACLE MINUTE: The O-ring

We were in Mexican waters on the Sea of Cortez when the Lord showed off His care for even the smallest things in our lives. Sea Venture, our 50’ sailing ketch and home for a number of years, had a 45-gallon-per-hour, reverse-osmosis watermaker I’d built to keep us in fresh water for onboard luxuries like regular showers and a working washing machine.

I was in the process of reassembling the two high-pressure membrane housings when I realized an O-ring had gone missing. This O-ring seals the filter; without it, the perfect plan for making water was at risk. The ring resembles a 2.25” diameter gasket. Picture the gasket in cross section as a rubber cord with the diameter of a pencil lead. And this valuable part of the assembly had vanished.

I’d set it on the teak floorboards in front of the engine compartment, along with all the other bits and pieces for the job. Now we had to find it. Normandie and I scoured the pilothouse floor, the surfaces, the stairs leading down to the lower salon, the surfaces there, the engine compartment.

Nothing.

I moved my laptop and papers from the nav station desk. I checked inside the nav station, which requires lifting the desk’s top and looking inside. I wiped the shelves clean, the desktop clean, the floor clean.

It was gone.

Maybe the Lord wanted to teach us something?

We remembered Elisha and the axe head floating (2 Kings 6:6), and so we prayed that God would raise our axe head (the O-ring). And then we rested.

Days passed. I continued to use my laptop and the navigation desk. I continued to flip open the top of the desk to get pens or paper.

We continued in prayer and praise to our mighty God.

And then one day, about a week later, I sat down at the desk, and there it was, the O-ring, centered on the desktop (the top that had been opened and closed at least a dozen times), about three inches from the desk’s edge.

God had floated the axe head for us in a way that could not be attributed to anything but His grace, His sense of humor, and His timing.

This isn’t the only example in our lives of God pointing us to something that had been missing, but it is certainly the most memorable. To Him only be the glory!! Michael Fischer
